It was really scary; there was nobody around, and I spent four hours there. **Eventually**, another climber appeared and helped me come back down. I was very lucky!

The most amazing mountain I have climbed is Mount Merapi on the island of Java. This is an active volcano, which I climbed with some Indonesian friends. 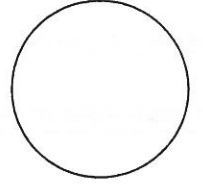
